Ash's Letter

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. – Philippians 4: 6 - 7

As I sit here writing this in early June, guess what? It's raining again! Over these past seven or eight months it seems that almost every week has contained rain and I'm waiting along with everyone else for a dry, sunny week as a signal that the seasons have finally changed and summer has arrived. Sometimes change is good and necessary and can bring real benefits. However, it's also true that sometimes change can be daunting and scary.

As you know, we're in the process at the moment of changing our senior leader at Ackworth Community Church. Hopefully, during the month of July, Michael will be joining me in the day to day running of the church, seeing how things work and learning about the wonders and the intricacies of things like the church store cupboard, which is a puzzle to behold. Also, pray that God will be giving them some keys that will be opening doorways of opportunities for us as a church.

I'm sure you can think of other examples too. The theme of them all is not to worry because we have a heavenly Father, who is good and in control. I realise that this is easier said than done sometimes but they are good thoughts to hang onto in seasons of change. I think also that around these scriptures there are many helpful practical helps that teach us the art of trusting rather than worrying and hopefully, we'll be able to have a look a bit further at them over these coming weeks.

God's Eternal Generosity

In Daniel 2:23, we witness a moment of gratitude for God's eternal generosity. Daniel, faced with a challenging situation, turns to God for wisdom and power. God's response is quick and generous, providing not only the revelation of King Nebuchadnezzar's dream but also its interpretation. This act of divine generosity highlights a timeless truth: God always gives us whatever we need, whenever we need it.

Daniel's experience is a powerful reminder that our eternal God's resources are limitless, and his willingness to give us what we need is boundless. When we trust in God, we can be assured that he will provide exactly what we need at the right moment. Just as God granted Daniel wisdom and power in his time of need, God promises to meet our needs. This teaches us to trust in God's timing, knowing that he is aware of our circumstances and will act at the right time. Often, we may feel anxious or impatient, wanting immediate answers or solutions. However, God sees the bigger picture and knows the best moment to intervene. God's delays are not denials. Instead, they're purposeful pauses that prepare us for what is to come. By waiting on God, we learn patience and develop deeper faith. Trusting in God's timing means believing that he knows what is best for us and that his provision will come at the most beneficial moment.



Experiencing God's generosity should fill us with awe and gratitude. Like Daniel, we should regularly thank and praise God for his gifts and pursue a deeper connection with him. God's eternal generosity helps us to recognize his constant presence and care, and it inspires us to live in a state of continual thankfulness. This will transform our perspective, allowing us to see glimpses of God in both the extraordinary and the everyday moments of our lives.

We can embrace the assurance that God will always provide for our needs. This means approaching God with our requests, trusting in God's timing, and being open to God's answers. When we experience God's provision, we should celebrate God's wonderful work by thanking and praising him as Daniel did. The more we do so, the more our faith can grow to rely on God's generosity at all times.

Kindness

Steve Sjogren wrote a book called Conspiracy of Kindness. He started a church in Cincinnati, Ohio, that grew to an average attendance of over 7,000. Their motto is, 'Small things done with great love are changing the world.' They carry out random acts of kindness like paying for a stranger's coffee or writing a 'thank you' note to a shop assistant.

Kindness is love in work clothes. Showing God's love in practical ways, they have discovered the power of kindness to effect positive change, both in their lives and in the lives of people around them. Unexpected kindness is the most powerful, least costly and most underrated agent of human change. When kindness is expressed, healthy relationships are created, community connections are nourished and people are inspired to pass on kindness.

God is kind. He loves you. Whatever your needs are today, you can cry out to him and he will be your help and deliverer.

David prays, 'God! Please hurry to my rescue! God, come quickly to my side!' (v.1, MSG). He goes on, 'Yet I am poor and needy; come quickly to me, O God. You are my help and my deliverer; O LORD, do not delay' (v.5). As he cries out, he remembers God's kindness to him in the past.

'God Opened the Door for Breaking Down Barriers'!


So [Peter and Cornelius] talked together and went inside, where many others were assembled.

Peter told them, "You know it is against our laws for a Jewish man to enter a Gentile home like this or to associate with you. But God has shown me that I should no longer think of anyone as impure or unclean. So I came without objection as soon as I was sent for. Now tell me why you sent for me." Acts 10:27-29 NLT

Breaking down barriers between Jews and Gentiles was an enormous task in Peter's day. However, breaking down barriers had been revealed as God's plan since he first called Abraham centuries earlier (Genesis 12:1-3). Cornelius was the perfect initial case of a Gentile coming to Christ. So, through Peter's vision, angels, the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and Cornelius' messengers, God opened the door for Peter to go to Cornelius. Let's commit to pray for open doors — open for us to go and for hearts to be ready to hear — so we can better share the Good News of Jesus, today.

Dear Father, please open my heart and my eyes to the people around me who are seeking to know Jesus. Open the doors of their hearts to receive the message I long to share with them. Please, dear Father, send your Spirit afresh in my time so that I can be your instrument to take Jesus' grace to those who do not know him. I ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.
