Malawi Prayer Update.

Some good news from Malawi.

One of the churches in the Dedza district is experiencing such rapid growth they are having problems making enough bricks to expand the church building! The same church is running its discipleship course in the local village with people who don't attend the church, please pray that the people will become disciples!

5 new churches have been established in villages around the city of Lilongwe, please pray that new leaders will be appointed and that the new converts are truly rooted in Christ.

Please pray for Josiah, one of the leaders in the Lilongwe district, who is seeking the Lord about whether he should move to be involved in the leadership of the churches in the south of Malawi.

Please pray for David, a brother planting and leading churches in Mozambique, just across the border from Malawi.

Please pray for Jospeh, who is leading church plants in the Nchisi district

Please pray for rain. Like much of southern Africa, Malawi is experiencing severe drought, particularly in the south of the country. The people have planted seed three times, the first two plantings failed to germinate due to lack of rain, it is essential that there is enough rain for the third planting of seed to grow successfully. They need consistent rain through to the end of March for crops to succeed.

Julian is planning to visit Malawi this year and asks for prayer for the wisdom about when to schedule his trip.

Verse of the Month..



He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8

I'll let Rick Warren speak for me (well, partly) this month...

"The first tool God uses in changing us is the Bible... if you are serious about changing your life [I'm guessing that not everything is smooth sailing and running like clockwork, in the lives of anyone reading this]. You need to **read it, study it, memorise it, meditate on it** and **apply it**. When people tell me their faith is weak, I ask them, 'are you reading your Bible regularly?' 'Hmm, not really.' 'Are you studying the Bible?' 'Well, not exactly.' Are you memorising Scripture?' 'Hmm, no.' Well, how do you expect your faith to grow?'

Romans 10:7 tells us that *faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God…*" Rick Warren, God's Power to Change Your Life, Zondervan, 2006

Here's the same verse, Romans 10:17 in the NIV, *Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ.*

The verse this month, from Micah, is another very well-known one and a great one to meditate upon over the next month and of course to put into practice. If you are memorising all the Scriptures for each month, don't forget to keep going back and reviewing them and checking you still have them right. Our minds soon lapse and start filling in the gaps in our memory.

Certainly, I suggest you meditate on it. Read it prayerfully, mull it over, ponder it with a heart to receive what God has to say or show you. Perhaps you might reflect on what it means to 'walk humbly with your God'? Or to 'love mercy'. But it's for your journey... I'm sure you'll be blessed as you read it and I recommend at least once reading the preceding verses for context.




